**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the report of the Commission to Study the Status of Nursing Professions in Maine is due to be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources by January 29, 1989; and

Whereas, additional hearings are necessary to accomplish the 11 purposes of the study; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Resolve 1987, c. 106, amended. Resolved: That Resolve 1987, c. 106, in the 3rd resolve clause, be amended to read:

**Reports. Resolved:** That the commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resources to the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature by January-29 <u>February 25</u>, 1989; and be it further

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The Commission to Study the Status of Nursing Professions in Maine was scheduled to present its findings by January 29, 1989. This resolve extends that deadline to February 25, 1989 and allows the commission to hold additional necessary hearings.
