COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 48, L.D. 62, "Resolve, to Require the Manufactured Housing Board to Develop a Manufactured Housing Installation Standard"

Amend the resolve by striking out all of the 3rd, 4th and 5th resolve paragraphs (page 2, lines 1 to 19 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:

**Report; recommended legislation. Resolved:** That the Manufactured Housing Board shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over legal affairs by March 1, 1990, concerning the installation standard proposed by the board, the board's recommendation regarding the issue of preemption and any other recommended legislation the board determines necessary; and be it further'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides additional time for the Manufactured Housing Board to develop an installation standard. The board must report its recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Legal Affairs by March 1, 1990.

This amendment deletes the requirement that the board adopt the standard once developed because the Legislature will review the standard and the issue of preemption of local standards before the standard will be adopted. The board will also have an opportunity to propose legislation it determines necessary.

This amendment deletes the requirement that the board scientifically survey installations.
