#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Increase the Motor Vehicle Inspection Fees.



### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §2502, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1983, c. 370, §4, is further amended to read:
- 2. Inspection fee. The inspection fee is \$5 \$6 for each inspection and is payable whether the vehicle passes inspection or not.
  - Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §2518, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1985, c. 14, §1, is further amended to read:
    - 1. Disposition of stickers. All inspection stickers and materials issued to inspection stations by the Chief of the State Police shall remain the property of the State. Each official inspection station shall stock a sufficient number of stickers to meet their demands at all times. These shall be furnished by the Chief of the State Police at 50¢ \$1 each. The stickers shall be made of such material and quality of adhesive as prescribed by the Chief of the State Police.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The Bureau of State Police is responsible for the administration of the motor vehicle inspection program. As part of that program the bureau is responsible for the printing and distribution of inspection stickers. The bill seeks to raise the cost which an inspection station is charged for each sticker from 50¢ to \$1 to avoid an anticipated shortfall in the funds needed to administer the current program.

The bill also raises the fee charged by inspection stations for performance of the annual motor vehicle inspection from \$5 to \$6. The increase in the fee allows the inspection stations to pass on the added sticker cost plus realize an additional 50% toward the cost of performing each inspection.
