An Act to Fund the Cost of the Salaries for Professionals in New or Expanded Special Education or Gifted and Talented Programs on a One-year Basis.

(EMERGENCY)

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows school units to include year-old costs for
new professional positions in special education or gifted and
talented programs in their program allocation in the school
funding formula. The effect is to reduce the lag time for
including these new costs in the calculation of the school units'
subsidy from 2 years to one year and to make the subsidy for
special education better reflect actual one-year-old costs.
