- for fiscal year 1989-90 and \$6,750 for fiscal year 1990-91. This appropriation will provide funds for blood test kits, breath test kits and laboratory analyses as well as for anticipated classroom costs associated with the training for required breath alcohol tests;
 - 3. Require no additional personnel for the Department of Marine Resources and the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. These departments will absorb any additional enforcement-related costs utilizing existing resources; and

4. Result in the Judicial Department absorbing all costs associated with the potential for additional court cases by utilizing existing resources. Also, the Judicial Department has indicated that this bill will result in increases in revenue from the collection of fines in the following amounts:

STATEMENT OF FACT

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The amendment provides that payment of persons authorized to perform a chemical test on one suspected of operating a watercraft while under the influence shall come from the dedicated funds of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, when a game warden has authorized the test and from funds of the Department of Marine Resources when a marine patrol officer has authorized the test. This change reflects the fact that, under current law, the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, section 7800 and section 7910, subsection 6, fines, penalties and costs collected for violation of watercraft laws are shared by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources.

The amendment allows towns to enter into agreements, in the manner provided for by Title 30-A, section 2674, regarding provision of mutual aid in enforcing laws governing watercraft operating under the influence.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
