Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study a Workers' Compensation State Fund.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Commission established; purpose. Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House, one of whom shall be a member of the minority political party; 37 39 D. Two members designated by the Maine Board of Directors of the AFL-CIO; 41 Е. One member designated by the Maine Board of Directors of 43 the Maine Chamber of Commerce and Industry; 45 One member designated by the Maine Board of Directors of F. the National Federation of Independent Businessmen; and 47 G. One member appointed jointly by the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House to 49 represent the insurance industry. 51 2. The commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from among its membership. 53 55 з. Seven members present and voting shall constitute a quorum necessary for purposes of making recommendations pursuant to this resolve; and be it further

Meetings. Resolved: That the commission shall meet as often as necessary to complete its tasks pursuant to this resolve. The first meeting shall be called jointly by the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate to be held no later than 100 days following adjournment of the First Regular Session of the 114th Legislature; and be it further

11 Compensation. Resolved: That the legislative members of the commission shall receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. If the commission meets on a day when the Legislature is in session, legislative members shall receive only one legislative per diem on that day, but may be reimbursed for all necessary expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further

Staff. Resolved: That the commission may employ staff and 21 consultants as necessary and within its budget to accomplish the purpose of this resolve; and be it further

Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present its findings in a report in accordance with the Joint Rules, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by December 1, 1990; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve. The funds shall not lapse but shall be carried forward.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve proposes a commission to study the feasibility 55 of a state fund for the workers' compensation system. The commission is required to review the funding mechanisms of other

 states with respect to the workers' compensation systems in those states. In addition, the commission shall study states with an exclusive state fund and those with a competitive state fund to determine the effect of these funding mechanisms following their adoption. The commission is directed to determine the most appropriate means of financing the workers' compensation system in Maine.

9 The intent of the resolve is to represent on the commission all interests involved in workers' compensation in order to 11 address all the issues and hopefully to arrive at a consensus.

13 The commission will have funds to hire a consultant who is knowledgeable in the field of workers' compensation. In addition, the commission may employ additional staff necessary to undertake this study.

The commission will report the results of its study to the 19 First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature by December 1, 1990.
