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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " to H.P. 78, L.D. 109, "Resolve, Establishing the Commission to Study the Regulation of Welders"

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Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

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'Sec. 1. Commission created and charged. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Regulation of Welders is established. The commission shall:

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- Determine which agency of State Government issues
 certification of welder qualifications;
- 27 2. Determine the method by which qualifications of welders are determined;

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 Recommend the location of testing facilities, the method to qualify testing personnel and facilities, and a method of auditing personnel and facilities;

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- 4. Review the areas of welding activity which should be regulated;
- 5. Determine the cost of the recommended program and method of funding, including fee structure; and

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6. If the commission's recommendations call for a substantial increase in functions or practices regulated, provide as part of its report responses to the issues raised in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 12015, subsection 3; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Appointment. Resolved: That the commission shall 47 of 10 members, appointed by the Governor: representative of structural а fabrication company, 49 representative of a boiler and pressure vessel repair company, a welder representing the American Federation of Labor, a plant

engineer, a welding department instructor from a
vocational-technical institute, a boiler inspector from an
insurance company, a representative from the Board of Boiler
Rules, a representative of the Department of Transportation, a
representative of the Division of Licensing and Enforcement in
the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and a
representative of the Boiler, Elevator and Tramway Division in
the Department of Labor.
All appointments shall be made no later than 30 days
following the effective date of this resolve; and be it further
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Sec. 3. Convening of commission. Resolved: That when the
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appointment of all commission members is completed, the Governor
or the Governor's designee shall call the first meeting no later
than November 15, 1989; and be it further
Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall present
its findings, together with any recommended legislation, to the
joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction
over business legislation at the Second Regular Session of the
114th Legislature by March 1, 1990; and be it further
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Sec. 5. Assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Labor
shall provide staff assistance to the commission; and be it

Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That all members of the
commission shall receive reimbursement for expenses upon
application to the Commissioner of Labor; and be it further
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Sec. 7. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are
appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of
this resolve.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

- This amendment accomplishes the following relative to the resolve to establish a Commission to Study the Regulation of Welders:
- 9 1. Requires that the commission prepare the justification required by Maine law for any substantial increase in the regulation of welders that may be recommended.
- 2. Eliminates the 2 legislative members and adds a representative of the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation.
- 3. Requires the first commission meeting by November 15, 1989, and changes the report date from December 1, 1989 to March 1, 1990.
- 21 4. Changes the appropriation to reflect the elimination of the legislative members.
