COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 101, L.D. 120, Bill, "An Act to Make Changes to the Human Resource Development Council in Order to Conform with the United States Economic Dislocation and Worker Adjustment Assistance Act of 1988"

Amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 3 in paragraph B in subparagraph (1) in the last line (page 1, line 49 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "State;" and inserting in its place the following: 'State; and'

Further amend the bill in section 1, in subsection 3, in paragraph B, by striking out all of subparagraph (2) and inserting in its place the following:

'(2) Representatives of municipalities or counties who are nominated by the municipal officers or the county commissioners and representatives of local education agencies who are nominated by those agencies.'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in subsection 3 by striking out all of paragraph C and inserting in its place the following:

'C. The Governor shall appoint 5 representatives of organized labor and 4 representatives of community-based organizations in the State.'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the emergency clause the following:

'Sec. 5. Application. This Act shall apply retroactively to January 23, 1989.'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The costs of implementing the proposed changes to the

1 membership of the Human Resource Development Council could be
2 absorbed within the existing federal allocation to the Bureau of
3 Employment and Training Programs.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment makes the following changes to the bill.

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1. The amendment adds an inadvertently omitted word for
11 grammatical reasons.

13 2. The amendment clarifies references to "local government"
by explicitly referring to municipalities and counties.

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17 3. The amendment defines the membership of labor
organizations and community-based organizations by requiring the
19 Governor to appoint 5 representatives of organized labor and 4
representatives of community-based organizations.

21 4. The amendment provides that the bill will apply
retroactively to January 23, 1989, the date of the Governor's
23 executive order reconstituting the Human Resource Development
Council.

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27 5. Finally, the amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
