17	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
19	clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:
21	'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6802, as amended by PL 1985, c. 379, §5, is repealed.
23	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6803 is enacted to read:
25	
27	<u>§6803. Seaweed permit</u>
29	<b>1. Permit required.</b> It is unlawful for any person to harvest, possess, ship, transport or sell seaweed without a current seaweed permit or supplemental seaweed permit. An
31 33	employee or immediate relation of a seaweed permit holder may harvest, possess, ship, transport or sell seaweed for commercial purposes with a supplemental seaweed permit.
33	
35	2. Exceptions. The requirement of a permit shall not apply to:
37	A. The holder of a current marine worm dealer's license;
39	B. The holder of a current wholesale seafood license;

43	<u>C. Any person who harvests, possesses, ships or transports no more than 50 pounds of seaweed a day for noncommercial purposes;</u>
45	D. Charitable or municipal organizations that harvest,
47	possess, ship or transport seaweed for noncommercial use by that organization; or
49	F Anyone bergesting accessing chinning transacting or
51	E. Anyone harvesting, possessing, shipping, transporting or selling seaweed which has detached naturally and is dead.

1	3. Fees. The fee schedule for seaweed permits is as
	follows:
3	A. Six dollars for a resident seaweed permit;

7	<b>B.</b> Fifty dollars for a nonresident seaweed permit; and
•	C. Two dollars for a supplemental seaweed permit.

11	FISCAL NOTE
13	Enactment of this bill results in a loss of revenue to the General Fund in the amount of \$320 for fiscal year 1989-90 and
15	fiscal year 1990-91.'
17	STATEMENT OF FACT
19	
	This amendment replaces the bill. It restructures the
21	entire section dealing with seaweed permits to more clearly show the exemptions to the permit requirement. It adds exemptions for
23	harvesting of not more than 50 pounds of seaweed a day, for
25	charitable or municipal organizations' personal use; and for seaweed which has detached naturally and is dead.
