IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Limit Political Action Committee Expenditures in Support of or Opposition to Candidates for Legislative Office.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §1015, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:
- 2. Committees; corporations; associations. No political committee, other committee, corporation or association may make contributions to a candidate, in support of the candidacy of one person, aggregating more than \$5,000 in any election. No political action committee may make contributions to a candidate for legislative office, in support of the candidacy of that person, aggregating more than \$1,000 in any election.
- Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §1056, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6,
 is amended to read:
- 1. Aggregate expenditures. No committee may make expenditures in support of or opposition to the candidacy of one person or to a political committee in an aggregate amount greater than \$5,000 in any election, and in the event of a candidate for legislative office, in an aggregate amount greater than \$1,000 in any election.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, political action committee contributions per legislative candidate are set at a maximum of \$5,000. This bill changes that figure to \$1,000. This bill does not affect total political action committee contributions, but rather the amount per political action committee per candidate.
