IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Make Complimentary Doe Permits Available to Residents over 70 Years of Age who have a Complimentary Hunting License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 1 3 12 MRSA §7457, sub-§1, ¶H, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 230, is amended to read: 5 The commissioner may regulate the taking of antlerless н. deer within any area of the State, as necessary, to maintain 7 deer populations in balance with available habitat, provided that: Q demarcation of 11 (1)The each area shall follow recognizable physical boundaries such as rivers, roads 13 and railroad rights-of-way; 15 The determination is made and published prior to (2) August 1st of each year; 17 The commissioner may implement an antlerless deer (3) permit system, provided that, by March 1st of the year 19 of implementation, the department shall submit the rules necessary for the system to the joint standing 21 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 23 inland fisheries and wildlife for review, comment and submission of any necessary legislation; 25 (4) If antler1ess deer permit system is an 27 implemented, the application fee for a permit to take an antlerless deer shall not exceed \$1; 29 The commissioner may adopt rules necessary for the (5) 31 administration, implementation, enforcement and interpretation of this subsection, except that there shall be no antlerless deer permit system unless 33 otherwise specified in this paragraph; and 35 Subparagraph (3) shall be repealed 30 days after (6) 37 the submission by the department to the committee of the rules necessary for a permit system +; and 39 <u>(7</u>) If an antlerless deer permit system is implemented, a complimentary deer permit to hunt 41 antlerless deer shall be issued to any resident of Maine 70 years of age or older who has a complimentary 43 hunting license pursuant to section 7076, subsection 1, 45 upon application to the commissioner. 47
