An Act to Provide Civil Penalties for Certain Unfair Trade Practices by Insurers.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	24-A MRSA §2165-A is enacted to read:
5	§2165-A. Civil penalties
7 .	The superintendent may assess a civil penalty against any person who has engaged in or is engaging in any act or practice
9	defined in or prohibited under this chapter, or against a resident of this State who has so engaged in another state. The
11	superintendent may assess a civil forfeiture of up to \$500 in the case of an individual and a civil penalty of up to \$2,000 in the
13	case of a corporation or entity other than an individual, following an adjudicatory hearing governed by the Maine
15	Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV.
17	The civil forfeiture or penalty may be assessed in addition to the issuance of a desist order as provided in section 2165.
19	to the issuance of a desist order as provided in section 2103.
21	STATEMENT OF FACT
23	The bill authorizes the Superintendent of Insurance to
25	assess monetary penalties against persons who violate provisions of the chapter of Maine Insurance Code dealing with unfair trade
27	practices and frauds. The penalties could be imposed only after a hearing held in accordance with the Maine Administrative
29	Procedure Act, Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375. The superintendent may assess the penalties in addition to issuing a
31	desist order.
