IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Authorizing Local Control of the Posting of Speed Limits.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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29 MRSA §1256, as amended by PL 1971, c. 593, §22, is further amended to read:

§1256. Municipalities may alter speed regulations; signal devices; speed in parks

9 Municipalities shall have no the power to alter any speed limitations or-to-enact-or-enforce-any-regulations-contrary-to-11 this-Titles-except-that-they in their municipality. They may by ordinances or bylaws regulate traffic by means of signal devices 13 or other appropriate methods on any portion of the way where traffic is heavy or continuous, and prohibit other than one-way 15 traffic upon certain ways, subject to Title 23, section 1351. The speed of vehicles in public parks may be regulated in like manner 17 provided there shall be erected at all entrances to such parks signs giving adequate notice of any such special speed 19 regulations.

21 Municipal officers in their respective jurisdictions are authorized in their discretion, but subject to the approval of 23 the Department of Transportation, with the consent and approval of the Chief of the Maine State Police, to increase the speed 25 which shall be lawful upon through ways at the entrances to which vehicles are required to stop before entering or crossing such 27 through ways. Municipal officers shall place and maintain upon all through ways upon which the permissible speed is increased 29 adequate signs giving notice of such regulations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to give municipalities the right to regulate the speed limits in their municipality.
