17	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its
19	place the following:
21	'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7110 is enacted to read:
23	§7110. Bear hunting permit
25	 Permit required. A permit is required to hunt for bear from the first Monday preceding September 1st to the day
27	preceding the open firearm season on deer. This section does not apply to trapping for bear.

31	2. Eligibility. Any person who possesses a valid license to hunt big game may obtain a permit to hunt for bear from the commissioner or an authorized agent.

35	3. Issuance: fee. The commissioner, through the commissioner's authorized agent, shall issue a bear hunting
37	permit to eligible persons. The fee for each permit issued shall be \$2 for residents and \$10 for nonresidents and aliens.
39	4. Restrictions. The following restrictions apply to hunting for bear when a permit is required.

43	A. A bear hunting permit must be kept on the person at all

31	This bill will:
3 3	1. Result in an increase in dedicated revenues to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife of \$225,000 for
35	fiscal year 1990-91. This increase is based on the assumption that there would be approximately 37,500 bear hunters who would
37	purchase a bear hunting permit. Also, this estimate assumes that 50% of these hunters would be residents and 50% would be
39	nonresidents; and
41	2. Require an allocation of dedicated revenue to the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in the amount of
43	\$10,000 for fiscal year 1989-90 and fiscal year 1990-91. This allocation would provide funds for anticipated printing and
45	general operating expenses for implementing the permit system.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This amendment establishes a bear hunting permit which will be required, in addition to a big game hunting license, to hunt for bear prior to the opening of the firearm season on deer. 7 This permit will provide a means of monitoring bear hunting g pressure, hunter success and the status of the black bear population, and will establish a mechanism for maintaining harvests within acceptable levels if such action becomes 11 necessary. The amendment also adds an allocation, an effective date provision and a fiscal note. 13
