- The membership of the commission is expanded from 13 to 15 by adding an additional Senate and House of Representatives member. The appointment process is changed to provide for input by various represented constituencies in the selection process.
- 9 The number of public meetings around the State is increased from 3 to at least 5; and provision is made for input by the State

11 Board of Education.
