| 25   | occurring while the employee was on duty, for the purpose of conducting a blood-alcohol test to determine whether the employee   |
| 27   | was intoxicated at the time of the accident or injury.   |

| 33   | This amendment permits employers to require employees to provide blood samples immediately after an accident if the employer has probable cause to believe that the employee was |
| 35   | intoxicated at the time of the accident. This amendment also removes language referring to the taking of blood samples during  |
| 37   | routine physical examinations, when needed for emergencies, and when the employee consents.  |
