#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Alter Certain Provisions of the Weights and Measures Laws to Recognize the Recently Created National Institute of Standards and Technology.



#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §2351, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 91, §3, is amended to read:

#### §2351. Systems of weights and measures

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The system of weights and measures in customary use in the United States and the metric system of weights and measures are jointly recognized and either one or both of these systems shall be used for all commercial purposes in the State. The definitions of basic units of weight and measure, the tables of weight and measure and weights and measures equivalents as published by the National Bureau of Standards or it's successor organization, the National Institute of Standards and Technology, are recognized shall govern weighing and measuring equipment transactions in the State.

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Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §2352, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, 19 c. 91, §3, is amended to read:

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#### §2352. Physical standards

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Weights and measures that are traceable to the United States prototype standards supplied by the Federal Government, approved as being satisfactory by the National Standards, or it's successor organization, the National Institute of Standards and Technology, shall be the state primary standards of weights and measures and shall be maintained in calibration as prescribed by the National Bureau of Standards or the National Institute of Standards and Technology, as applicable. All secondary standards may be prescribed by the state sealer and shall be verified upon their initial receipt and as often thereafter as deemed determined necessary by the state sealer.

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Sec. 3. 10 MRSA § 2353, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 91, §3, is amended to read:

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### §2353. Technical requirements for commercial devices

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The specifications, tolerances and other requirements for commercial weighing and measuring devices as adopted by the National Conference on Weights and Measures and in National Bureau of Standards "Specifications, Tolerances and Other Technical Requirements for Commercial Weighing and Measuring Devices," or published in the National Institute of Standards and Technology Handbook 44, 1990, supplements therete revisions orthereof to those publications, shall apply to commercial weighing and measuring devices in the State, except insofar as modified or rejected by regulation.

Sec. 4. 10 MRSA §2628, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 91, §10, is amended to read:

## §2628. Conformity to national method of sale regulations

The methods, units, terms and other requirements for the sale of commodities, as adopted by the National Conference on Weights and Measures and published in the National Bureau of Standards, or as published in the National Institute of Standards and Technology, "Model State Method of Sale of Commodities Regulation," and supplements thereto or revisions thereof to those publications, shall apply to the sale of commodities in the State of Maine, except insofar as specifically modified, amended or rejected by a regulation issued by the state sealer.

Sec. 5. 10 MRSA §2629, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 91, §10, is amended to read:

### §2629. Conformity to national packaging and labeling regulations

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The packaging and labeling requirements for consumer and nonconsumer packages, as adopted by the National Conference on Weights and Measures and published in the National Bureau of Standards, "Model State Packaging and Labeling Regulation," and supplements—thereto—or—revisions—thereof, or in publications of the National Institute of Standards and Technology, successor organization to the National Bureau of Standards, or in any supplements or revisions to those publications, shall apply to any package kept for the purpose of sale or offered or exposed for sale in the State of Maine, except insofar as specifically modified, amended or rejected by a regulation issued by the state sealer.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

In August 1988, federal legislation created the National Institute of Standards and Technology which is the successor organization to the National Bureau of Standards. The National Institute of Standards and Technology will retain all of the traditional functions of the National Bureau of Standards and will assume several new roles as well.

The purpose of this bill is to make the corrections necessary for existing Maine laws to reference the appropriate federal agency.
