IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Amend the Labor Laws Regarding Union Strike Activities.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	26 MRSA §596 is enacted to read:
5	§596. Secret ballot vote required for strikes
7	1. Secret ballot votes. No union may authorize a strike until it has received approval for the strike by means of a
9	secret ballot vote held in accordance with subsection 2.
11	2. Notice; form of ballot. A secret ballot vote may not be held within 48 hours of any anticipated strike activity by the
13	union. Adequate notice of the vote must be provided to all union members at least 7 days before the planned vote. The union shall
15	provide absentee secret ballots for those who are unable to vote in person. The ballot must clearly state the date and time of
17	the intended strike activity. Approval of a strike must be by a majority of union members who have voted by secret ballot in
19 ·	favor of holding a strike.

23	STATEMENT OF FACT
25	This bill provides that a union may not go on strike until a secret ballot vote by its members authorizes that strike.
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
