An Act Concerning Agents Selling Hunting and Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7072, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1985, c. 304, §3, is further amended to read:

3. Agents for the purpose of selling licenses to 7 nonresidents. Agents, other than clerks of towns, for the purpose of selling licenses to nonresidents shall be appointed as 9 follows:

A. The commissioner shall may designate as an agent for the purpose of selling nonresident licenses any business located in-the-State which submits a complete application, is credit worthy and has not violated any provision of this Part. A business,-the-agency-of-which-is-revoked,-may-reapply-for-an agency-for-the-2nd-year-following-the-last-year-it-held-an agency.--The-commissioner-may,--subject-to-this-subsection, establish-agents-outside-this-State-for-the-purpose-of selling-nonresident-licenses.

21 B---An-applicant-for-an-agency-shall-submit-a-nonrefundable \$30-application-fee-with-the-application-and-a-\$30-fee-each year-thereafter-for-renewal.

25 C.-.-The-commissioner-may-waive-the-\$30-fee-for-an-agency selling-50--licenses-or-less-annually,--located--in--a
27 geographical-area-where-no-other-agency-exists-and-where-the commissioner-determines-that-an-agency-is-necessary-to-serve
29 the-needs-of-nonresident-hunters-and-fishermen.

STATEMENT OF FACT

 35 Currently, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is required to designate as an agent for the sale of nonresident
 37 hunting and fishing licenses any business which makes an application. A \$30 fee is required for being an agent.

This bill eliminates the requirement that the department designate any business and eliminates the fee for those businesses that are selected.
