Resolve, to Extend the Reporting Deadline for the Study of Low-level Radioactive Waste in the Town of Greenbush.

(EMERGENCY)



1	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the
3	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
5	Whereas, this legislation is necessary so that the State Geologist may report findings in a timely manner; and

9	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
11	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it
13	Resolve 1987, c. 113, amended. Resolved: That Resolve 1987, c.
15	113, the 2nd resolve paragraph, is amended to read:
17	Report. Resolved: That the University and the Town shall issue a report on the findings to the Joint Standing Committee of
19	the Legislature on Energy and Natural Resources by January 15, 1989 1990; and be it further
