15 17	Amend the bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following:
19	'An Act to Provide a Special Adjustment for Border Hospitals Experiencing Economic Hardship'
21	Further amend the bill in the emergency preamble by striking
23	out all of the 2nd to 5th paragraphs (page 1, lines 5 to 25 in L.D.) and inserting in their place the following:
25	'Whereas, certain border hospitals are experiencing
27	economic hardship that may result in the loss of valuable health services in border communities unless special relief is provided
29	rapidly through the hospital regulatory system; and
31	Whereas, the necessary relief cannot be provided without changes in the current law; and'
33	Further amend the bill by striking out everything after the
35	enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place the following:

3	(2) "Economic hardship" means an excess of reasonably
5	budgeted, noncapital, acute care operating expenses over noncapital financial requirements.

11	B. In considering an adjustment under this subsection, the commission shall determine the extent to which the hospital
13	has demonstrated that its economic hardship is attributable to unique circumstances affecting border hospitals. In no
15	event may an adjustment under this subsection exceed the portion of a hospital's economic hardship attributed to the
17	unique circumstances of border hospitals.
19	C. This adjustment may be made during the course of the 5th payment year. An adjustment under this subsection shall
21	become part of payment year financial requirements for purposes of computing subsequent payment year financial
23	requirements pursuant to section 396-C.
25	D. This subsection is repealed October 1, 1991.
27	STATEMENT OF FACT
29	This amendment changes the bill which previously would have
31	essentially exempted York Hospital from the Health Care Finance Commission's regulations as part of a demonstration project.
33	Under this amendment, York Hospital would remain subject to the commission's control. The commission would be authorized to make
35	a special adjustment to the extent that a border hospital acted reasonably and necessarily in incurring extraordinary costs in
37	response to unique circumstances affecting border hospitals.
