IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Establish a Demonstration Project at the York Hospital.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the York Hospital occupies a unique niche in the Maine health care system, being the closest Maine hospital to the New Hampshire border and in competition with 3 hospitals across the border, including a for-profit hospital; and

Whereas, the Maine Health Care Finance Commission has not appropriately recognized the York Hospital's special problems due to its geographic location, which includes being in the labor market with the lowest unemployment rate in the United States; and

Whereas, the commission has not responded to the hospital's request for a demonstration project to operate with an experimental reimbursement model that would require York Hospital's Board of Trustees to set a prospective revenue limit based on local market conditions; and

Whereas, the Legislature therefore finds that such facts constitute an emergency, particularly in light of the enormous financial losses suffered by the York Hospital while under control by the commission, which jeopardize its continued existence; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §396-0, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 579, §10, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §396-R is enacted to read:

§396-R. Experimental and demonstration projects

1. Projects generally. The commission may, with the written agreement of any directly affected hospital, 3rd-party payor or purchaser, implement experimental or demonstration projects designed to assess methods of establishing revenue limits or payment methodologies other than those established under this chapter. The commission shall consult with appropriate advisory committees prior to initiating any experimental or demonstration project and shall include the results of any project as part of its annual report. These experimental or demonstration projects may include, but need not be limited to, the following:

1	A. Establishment of regional hospital corporations;
3	B. Payment on the basis of diagnostic related groups;
5	C. Payment on a capitation basis:
7	D. Preferred provider relationships; and
,9	E. The efficacy of competition as a means of regulating hospital spending.

13	2. Competition demonstration. The commission shall implement, effective July 1, 1989, a competition demonstration project sited at York Hospital. This project shall have a second control of the commission of
15	duration of no less than 5 years and shall exempt York Hospital from the system of revenue limits established under this

19	A. For each year of the project, assure that its total net

47	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
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STATEMENT OF FACT

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A variety of factors have made the Maine Health Care Finance Commission's regulations, which are based on statewide averages, inappropriate for York Hospital. These factors include local housing and labor costs which are higher in York County than state averages and strong competitive pressures exerted across state lines from neighboring hospitals in New Hampshire which are not subject to significant economic regulation. As a result, York Hospital has been experiencing significant financial losses under commission regulations. This bill would remedy this problem by exempting York Hospital from the commission's system of revenue limits for a period of 5 years. It would also take advantage of this exemption as an opportunity for a demonstration project to compare the effectiveness of competition across state lines as a means of controlling hospital spending, with the effectiveness of those regulatory controls which continue to apply to Maine hospitals during the 5-year period. York Hospital will be required to make certain reports which are necessary for evaluating the results of the competition demonstration project. Payors for health care will be protected by a ceiling on the hospital's revenues of 102% of its audited costs.
