IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Enhance the Natural Fish Die-off Clean-up Program.



 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

- Whereas, the current funding of \$10,000 is insufficient to adequately fund the Natural Fish Die-off Clean-up Program; and
- Whereas, more adequate and certain funding needs to be available to municipalities; and

11 Whereas, failure to provide this funding prior to the 1989 tourist season will result in the inability of affected 13 municipalities to act swiftly to clean up natural fish die-offs; and

Whereas, this failure will create a noxious nuisance in coastal tourist areas resulting in decreased tourist activity and irreparable economic hardship to those areas which rely on tourist trade; and

21 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 23 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 25 safety; now, therefore,

- 27 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 29 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6132, as amended by PL 1987, c. 459, is further amended to read:
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§6132. Natural Fish Die-off Clean-up Program

Upon the request of any affected municipality, the 35 Department of Marine Resources shall assess the extent and severity of public nuisance and potential threats to public 37 health posed by natural fish die-offs. The department shall provide technical advice and,-subject-to-the-limits-of-available 39 funding--financial-assistance to the affected municipalities in the conduct of any cleanup or other mitigating measures.

The department shall maintain a nonlapsing fund of \$50,00043to provide financial assistance to the affected municipalities
for cleanup or other mitigating measures. Each affected45municipality shall submit a statement of its expenses to the
department. The department shall annually reimburse the47municipalities for those expenses to the extent that funds are
available. Reimbursement shall be on a pro rata basis if the49combined expenses of all municipalities requesting reimbursement
during the annual period exceed the total in the fund.
