### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Clarify the Position and Authority of Inspectors and Fire Investigators in the Office of State Fire Marshal.



#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2396, first ¶, as amended by PL 1985, c. 785, Pt. B, §111, is further amended to read:

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The office of State Fire Marshal is hereby established as a bureau within the Department of Public Safety. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall appoint, as State Fire Marshal, a person experienced in fire prevention work, who may be removed for cause by the commissioner. The State Fire Marshal shall appoint, subject to the Civil Service Law, such inspectors, investigators and other employees as may be necessary to carry out the duties assigned to his the office. The State Fire Marshal shall carry out all of the duties and responsibilities assigned to his the office and such other duties as may be prescribed or delegated by the Commissioner of Public Safety and he the State Fire Marshal shall devote his the marshal's full time to the duties of his the office.

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Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2396, 2nd ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 632, §6, is amended to read:

It shall be the duty of the said State Fire Marshal, his the State Fire Marshal's deputy and any such inspectors and investigators to enforce all of the laws, ordinances, rules and regulations promulgated by the Commissioner of Public Safety or enforceable by him the Commissioner of Public Safety, directed toward and concerned with protection of the public in the following areas:

Sec. 3. 25 MRSA §2396, sub-§7, as repealed and replaced by PL 1973, c. 632, §6, is amended to read:

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7. Other duties. The performance of such other duties as are set forth in this and other sections of the statutes and as may be conferred or imposed from time to time by law.

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The State Fire Marshal, his the State Fire Marshal's deputy and inspectors investigators appointed under this Title shall carry out those functions which the Commissioner of Public Safety may direct and in so doing shall have the same enforcement powers and duties throughout the State as sheriffs have in their respective counties -- Such -enforcement -powers - are -- to -be - limited - in -scope - to enforcement -- of -- statutes / -- ordinances / -- rules -- and -- regulations concerned-with-fire-prevention,-arcon-and-other-burnings--and \_ have the enforcement powers of such other specific areas of responsibility as may by statute be assigned to the office of Fire Marshal, <u>have the power</u> arrest and to impersonation of or interference with, the State Fire Marshal, his the State Fire Marshal's deputy or , fire inspectors or investigators.

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1	STATEMENT OF FACT
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	Internal reorganization of the State Fire Marshal's field
5	staff resulted in the creation of fire investigators whose primary function is the investigation and cause determination of
7	accidental and incendiary fires. The primary function of fire inspectors is the prevention of fires through inspectional
9	programs.
11	Current statute identifies fire inspectors as having law enforcement authority equal to that of sheriffs within their
13	counties. Since the reorganization, fire inspectors are not provided with arrest powers while fire investigators are law
15	enforcement officers with arrest powers for a variety of fire related crimes.
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	This bill gives fire investigators the same law enforcement
19	authority as sheriffs have within their counties and will enable them to arrest for other crimes associated with arson

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investigation.
