IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Increase the License Fees for Hospitals and Long-term Care Facilities.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §1815, as amended by PL 1981, c. 703, Pt. A, §12, is further amended to read:

§1815. Fees

Each application for a license to operate a hospital, convalescent home or nursing home shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50-for-facilities-less-than-50-beds-in-size,--a-fee-of-\$100-fer-facilities-51-to-100-beds-in-size,--and-a-fee-ef-\$200-fer facilities-larger-than-100-beds-in-size \$5 for each bed contained within the facility. No Any such fee shall not be refunded. All licenses issued shall be renewed annually upon payment of a like fee. The state's State's share of all fees received by the department under this chapter shall be deposited in the General

Fund. No license granted shall may be assignable or transferable.

The current fee schedule for licenses for hospitals and long-term care facilities was established in 1975. During the past 13 years, there has been an increase in the number of licensed health care beds in the State. There has also been a large expansion of the licensure review and oversight activities of the Division of Licensing and Certification. In that period, there has been a significant degree of inflation. This bill, therefore, provides that the license fee be set at \$5 per bed to bring the fee to a level that addresses current costs and responsibilities.
