#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

14 MRSA §8102, sub-§1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §52, is amended to read:

Employee. "Employee" means a person acting on behalf of the governmental entity in any official capacity, and whether with or without temporarily or permanently, compensation from local, state or federal funds, including elected or appointed officials, volunteer firefighters as defined in Title-30,--section-3771, Title 30-A, section 3151; emergency medical service personnel, -- and; Maine Guardsmen while receiving state active duty pay under Title 37-B, section 143, in accordance with Title 37-B, sections 181 to 183 and 742, and while engaged in the Domestic Action Program; and sheriffs' deputies as defined in Title 30-A, section 381 when they are serving orders pursuant to section 3135, but the term "employee" shall not mean a person or other legal entity acting in the capacity of an independent contractor under contract to the governmental entity.

This bill extends coverage of the Maine Tort Claims Act to cover sheriffs' deputies when they are required to serve a civil order of arrest as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14, section 3135.
