29 The purpose of this bill is to fund a permanent coordinator/

coordinator will include training for and coordination of the
35 various BABES programs throughout the State which are committed
to alcohol and drug abuse prevention and the development of
37 positive living skills for child development and targeted to
children of preschool age to grade 4.
