An Act to Allow School Districts to Waive Up to 5 Days of Kindergarten for Screening.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	20-A MRSA §4801, sub-\$1, ¶D, is enacted to read:
5	D. A school administrative unit may provide for the use of up to 5 of the 175 instructional days required by this
7	section to be used for screening incoming first year students for the purpose of identifying exceptional students
9	and students at risk of school failure as required by state or federal law.
11	STATEMENT OF FACT
13	
15	This bill provides local school units with the option of using up to 5 of the 175 student instructional days in the kindergarten school year for screening incoming students for
17	special needs as required by state law. Appropriate screening instruments may be administered by school staff anytime during
