An Act to Improve Enforcement of Junkyard Laws.

1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 3 Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §3758, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 737, Pt. A, §2 and Pt. C, §106 is amended to read: 5 Whoever violates this subchapter or the 2. Penalties. 7 rules of the Department of Transportation adopted under section 3759 shall be penalized in accordance with section 4506. The 9 operation of a junkyard contrary to any term or condition of the permit or in violation of any ordinance adopted under this subchapter is a violation of this subchapter and is enforceable 11 under this section. Each day that the violation continues 13 constitutes a separate offense. Sec. 2. 30-A MRSA §3758, sub-§4 is enacted to read: 15 17 4. Suspension of operation. Notwithstanding subsection 3, a state, county or local law enforcement officer may suspend for 19 up to 30 days the operation of any junkyard in violation of this subchapter. Any person who operates a junkyard, the operation of which has been suspended under this subsection, commits a 21 violation of this subchapter. 23 25 STATEMENT OF FACT 27 This bill allows state, county and local law enforcement 29 officers to suspend, for up to 30 days, the operation of junkyards in violation of state law. Revocation and suspension of a permit to operate a junkyard would continue to be governed 31 by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 3758,
