NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Allow Minors Under 16 to Work in Hotels.



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1 26 MRSA §773, first ¶ is amended to read:

5 No minor under 16 years of age shall be employed, permitted
7 or suffered to work in, about or in connection with any
9 manufacturing or mechanical establishment, hotel, rooming house,
11 laundry, except those commonly known as automatic laundries, dry
13 cleaning establishments, bakery, bowling alley, poolroom,
15 commercial places of amusement, including traveling shows and
17 circuses, or in any theater or moving picture house. The
19 provisions of this section pertaining to theaters shall not apply
21 to minors under 16 years of age who are employed or in training
23 as theatrical actors.

15 Sec. 2. 26 MRSA §773, 3rd ¶, as amended by PL 1975, c. 238,
17 §2, is repealed.

19 Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §773, 6th ¶ is enacted to read:

21 No minor under 14 years of age may be employed, permitted or
23 suffered to work in, about or in connection with any hotel.

27 The purpose of this bill is to let 14-year-olds and
29 15-year-olds work in hotels.
