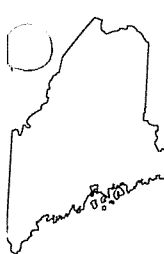

**An Act to Authorize Issuance of Complimentary Hunting, Trapping
and Fishing Licenses for Residents 70 Years of Age at Any Time
During the Calendar Year in Which They Attain the Age of 70.**



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **12 MRSA §7076, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1987, c. 742, §4, is**
5 further amended to read:

7 **1. Residents over 70 years of age.** A complimentary license
9 to hunt, trap or fish, including an archery license under section
11 7102, and a muzzle-loading hunting license under section 7107-A,
13 shall be issued to any resident of Maine who is 70 years of age
15 or older upon application to the commissioner. Residents who
17 apply for these complimentary licenses at any time during the
19 calendar year of their 70th birthdays shall be issued a license
21 upon application, regardless of the actual date during that
calendar year when they attain age 70. A guide license may be
renewed without charge for any resident of Maine who is 70 years
of age or older upon application to the commissioner. The
application shall be accompanied by a birth certificate or other
certified evidence of the applicant's date of birth and
residency. Each license issued under this subsection shall
remain valid through December 31st of the 2nd complete calendar
year following the year of issuance.

STATEMENT OF FACT

27 This bill allows residents age 70 and over to receive a
29 complimentary license to hunt, trap or fish at any time during
the calendar year in which they attain the age of 70.
