17	Amend the bill in the first line after the enacting clause
19	(page 1, line 18 in L.D.) by inserting at the beginning the following: 'Sec. 1.'
21	Further amend the bill by inserting before the emergency

25	Sec. 2. 39 MRSA §21-A, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
27	<b>4. Minors employed in lodging industry.</b> Notwithstanding section 4 and any other provision of this Act, a minor who is 15
29	years of age and who suffers an injury arising out of and in the course of employment in a kitchen, dining room, lobby or office
31	of public accommodations for lodging may file a civil action against the employer for damages resulting from that injury or
33	claim compensation from the employer under this Act. The employer is not entitled to the defense set forth in section 3 in
35	a civil action brought by the minor employee or the employee's
37	representative for personal injuries or death arising out of and in the course of that employment.'
39	Further amend the bill by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

43	STATEMENT OF FACT
45	This amendment permits 15-year-olds who are employed in the lodging industry under the bill and who are injured in the course
