An Act to Extend Reporting Deadlines of the Therapeutic Pharmaceutical Monitoring Panel.

(EMERGENCY)



1	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
3	as emergencies; and
5	Whereas, this legislation is necessary so that the Therapeutic Pharmaceutical Monitoring Panel may meet its

9	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
11	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and

15	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
17	32 MRSA §2428, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1987, c. 586, is further amended to read:

21	6. Report to the Legislature and Governor. The panel shall prepare and submit reports to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, the State Board of Optometry
23	and the State Board of Registration in Medicine. The reports shall summarize the findings of the panel regarding the use of
25	therapeutic pharmaceutical agents and shall be signed by all members of the panel. A report shall be submitted on the
27	following dates: July-30,-1988;-January-30 February 15, 1989; June-30,-1989; and January-30 February 15, 1990.
