IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Create a Fund to Assist Victims of Fraudulent Real Estate Transactions.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §13066, sub-§1, ¶E is enacted to read:
5	E. Upon petition of a person alleging damage and seeking compensation from the Real Estate Recovery Fund under
7	chapter 114, the commission shall conduct a hearing.

15	§13271. Establishment of fund
17	1. Fund. The commission shall establish and maintain the
19	Real Estate Recovery Fund, which is referred to in this subchapter as the "fund." The commission shall compensate from
21	the fund persons damaged by a person licensed pursuant to section 13003, acting as a real estate broker, who has been found by the
23	commission or a court under section 13066, subsection 1, paragraph A to have committed fraud in violation of this chapter.
25	2. Compensation. Pursuant to subsection 1, the commission
27	shall pay a person damaged an amount to compensate the person for the damage provided that the aggregate amount of the payment does
29	not exceed \$25,000 for the fraud of any one licensee in connection with any one transaction or claim, regardless of the
31	number of persons aggrieved or parcels of real estate involved. Prior to making payment from the fund, the commission shall
33	provide its written order to the licensee to compensate the person damaged in the amount established by the commission as
35	certain liquidated damages. If the licensee fails to compensate the person damaged within 20 days of the mailing date of the
37	order, the commission shall compensate the person from the fund for the amount of damages established within the limits of this
39	subsection and pursuant to the procedures set forth in section 13273.
41	3. Fee payable to fund. Any person who receives a license
43	under section 13003 for the first time shall pay to the director a fee of \$25 in addition to all other fees payable under this
45	chapter. Notwithstanding section 13069, subsection 4, the director shall credit this fee to the Real Estate Recovery Fund.
47	4. Credits to General Fund. The fees collected under
49	chapter shall be paid by the director to the Treasurer of State and shall constitute the Real Estate Recovery Fund. The
51	commission shall maintain the Real Estate Recovery Fund at a level not to exceed \$300,000. The director shall credit money

received under subsection 3 to the fund if the fund balance is below this amount. The Treasurer of State may invest or reinvest money in the fund in the same manner as funds of the Maine State Retirement System are invested. Any interest arising from these investments shall be credited to the General Fund. Any money received by the director under this section not required to maintain the fund balance shall be paid to the Treasurer of State to be credited to the General Fund. The Treasurer of State shall pay from the Real Estate Recovery Fund upon voucher by the director such compensation as may be due under this chapter.

\$13272. Limitation of Actions

No petition by a person alleging damage and seeking

compensation under this chapter may be brought later than 2 years
from the expiration of time for appeal from the finding by the

commission or a court of a violation of this chapter that serves

as the basis of the petition.

§13273. Recovery from fund

1. Petition; hearing. A person alleging damage and seeking compensation under this chapter shall file a petition pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV and any rules adopted under section 13065, subsection 1. The commission shall conduct a hearing on the petition pursuant to section 13065, subsection 1, section 13066, subsection 2 and the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV.

- 2. Finding; order. If the commission finds that the licensee complained of in the petition has committed fraud in violation of this chapter, or that a court has so found, and that the petitioner has been damaged by this fraud, the commission shall order the licensee to pay to the petitioner an amount that will compensate the petitioner for the petitioner's certain and liquidated damages within the limit established in section 13271, subsection 2.
- 3. Appeal; enforcement. Any person who is aggrieved by an order of the commission under this chapter shall be entitled to judicial review in the Superior Court in the manner provided in the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter VII. The commission may enforce its order as provided in Title 5, section 9064. The petitioner may seek to enforce the commission's order in the manner of execution to enforce a judgment for the payment of money under the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 4. Reimbursement of fund. If payment has been made from the fund to a damaged person under section 13271, subsection 2 and the order of the commission to the licensee to compensate the

damaged person is subsequently enforced or executed upon under subsection 3, the licensee shall make payment of the compensation to the director in the amount of the payment made from the fund to the person damaged. Any amount of compensation the licensee is required to pay the damaged person above the amount required to reimburse the fund shall be paid by the licensee to the person damaged. The licensee shall also pay to the director interest at the rate of 10% per annum on the unpaid compensation required to reimburse the fund. Interest shall be calculated from the date of the order of enforcement or execution under subsection 3.

- 5. License suspension. The commission shall seek, pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, section 10051 suspension of the license of a licensee required to make payment under subsection 4. Any such suspension shall be in effect until the licensee has made the required payments under subsection 4.
- 6. Insufficient funds. If, at any time, the money deposited in the fund is insufficient to satisfy any payments under section 13271, subsection 2, the commission shall, when sufficient money has been deposited in the fund, make the payments in the same order as the commission orders on which the payments are based were originally made. The commission shall, along with a payment under this subsection, pay interest calculated from the date of the original commission order at the rate of 10% per annum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes the Real Estate Recovery Fund, the purpose of which is to reimburse persons who have been damaged by a real estate licensee through that licensee's fraudulent conduct.

The limit of the reimbursement is \$25,000 for the fraudulent conduct of any licensee. The total amount in the fund is not to exceed \$300,000 and is to be generated from an additional charge of \$25 for first-time real estate licensees.

A law similar to this is currently in place in Connecticut and Kentucky.
