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25	This bill comprises the legislative recommendations of a
25	study conducted by a subcommittee of the Joint Standing Committee
27	on Appropriations and Financial Affairs as authorized in Public
_,	Law 1987, chapter 816. The study reviewed the methods by which
29	funds appropriated or allocated by the Legislature to the
	Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health
31	and Mental Retardation for providing community services are
	distributed.

	Both departments currently prepare an annual report on funds
35	contracted for community-based services. This bill requires the
	department to include additional information regarding the
37	distribution of funds by region and service area, an evaluation
	of the additional funding needed to remedy geographical
39	inequities in the current funding scheme, an assessment of
	outstanding service needs for community services and

recommendations for changes in funding.

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
