An Act to Amend an Act Incorporating the Trustees of Bridgton Academy.



1 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

3 **Mass. Laws of 1808, c. 105, §I,** as amended by P&S 1967, c. 4, §I,
5 is further amended to read:

7 **Section I.** Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
9 Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority
11 of the same, that an academy shall be, and hereby is established
13 at Bridgton, in the county of Cumberland, and that Mr. Samuel
15 Andrews, Mr. Robert Andrews, Mr. Aaron Beman, Stephen Chase,
17 Esquire, the Reverend Nathan Church, Mr. David Clark, Doctor Ezra
19 Dean, Samuel Farnsworth, Esquire, Mr. Benjamin Kimball, Enoch
21 Perley, Esquire, and Mr. Seba Smith, all of said Bridgton; the
23 Reverend Daniel Gould, of Bethel, the Reverend Lincoln Ripley, of
25 Waterford, Mr. Jonathan Bernard, of _____, and Mr. Nathaniel
27 Burnham of Harrison, be, and they are hereby appointed the
29 trustees of the said academy, and they and their successors in
31 the said trust, are hereby made and declared to be a body politic
33 and corporate, by the name of the Trustees of Bridgton Academy;
35 and the said trustees shall have, hold and continue in perpetual
37 succession, with all the powers and privileges usually given to,
39 and exercised and enjoyed by other academies; but the number of
41 the said trustees, ~~shall not be less than nine, nor more than
twenty, and five of whom may be a quorum for doing business~~ and
the quorum for doing business shall be as provided under the
bylaws of the Academy. And the said trustees may keep and use a
common seal, which they may alter or change when they see cause;
and all deeds or other instruments, made by the said corporation,
shall be signed and sealed with their seal, and executed,
delivered and acknowledged by the secretary and treasurer of the
said corporation by order of the trustees, and shall be binding
on the said corporation, and shall be good and valid in law.

STATEMENT OF FACT

37 The purpose of this bill is to let Bridgton Academy
39 determine the number of trustees and the quorum for doing
41 business by indicating the number of trustees and the quorum in
the bylaws of the Academy.
