### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to End Homelessness in Maine.



### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1813, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1987, c. 395, Pt. A, §21, is further amended to read:

- Surplus property. Providing for transfer of supplies, and equipment which are surplus from one state department or agency to another which may need them, and for the disposal by private and public sale of supplies, materials and equipment which are obsolete and unusable; provided, however, that if any political subdivision in the State or any educational institution or homeless shelter sponsor enumerated in section 1813-A requests to purchase any such obsolete and unusable items, then the disposal shall be by private sale to that political subdivision, homeless shelter sponsor or educational institution; that equipment to be retained for a period of at least one year in a current ongoing program. Any item purchased by a political subdivision, homeless shelter sponsor or educational institution under this section shall not be sold or transferred by that political subdivision, homeless shelter sponsor or educational institution for a period of 6 months from the date of the private sale and the State reserves the right to refuse to sell additional equipment to a political subdivision, homeless shelter sponsor or educational institution if it is determined that the political subdivision, homeless shelter sponsor or educational institution has not retained the equipment for the required period of 6 months;

  means a public or private nonprofit entity which owns or operates

- 2. Surplus property; private sale to educational institutions and homeless shelter sponsors. Pursuant to this chapter and rules promulgated under section 1813, the Department of Administration through the Bureau of Purchases shall allow private sales of surplus property to educational institutions and homeless shelter sponsors.
- Sec. 4. Interagency Committee on Homelessness; establishment. The Interagency Committee on Homelessness is established to inventory the availability of resources for the homeless, coordinate their efficient delivery and ensure full utilization of federal funds for the homeless. The committee shall be made up of the following persons or their representatives: the Commissioner of Human Services, the Commissioner of Labor, the Commissioner of
