**An Act to Provide Complimentary Marine Resources Licenses to
Certain Persons 75 Years of Age or Older.**



1 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6422 is enacted to read:

5 §6422. Special privileges

7 1. Complimentary licenses for residents over 75 years of
8 age. Upon application to the commissioner, a complimentary
9 lobster and crab fishing license shall be issued to any resident
10 of Maine who:

11 A. Is 75 years of age or older; and

13 B. Has held a lobster and crab fishing license for 5 of the
15 previous 10 years.

17 2. Age certified; duration of license. The application for
18 a complimentary license under this section shall be accompanied
19 by a birth certificate or other certified evidence of the
20 applicant's birth and residency. Each license issued under this
21 section shall remain valid through December 31st of the calendar
22 year in which the license was issued.

25 §6602. Special privileges

27 1. Complimentary licenses for residents over 75 years of
28 age. Upon application to the commissioner, a complimentary
29 shellfish license shall be issued to any resident of Maine who:

33 B. Has held a shellfish license for 5 of the previous 10
