IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Ensure the Appropriate Use of Gifts to the State.



1 Be it enacted by the P	eople of the	State of Maine	as follows:

4 MRSA §95, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1973, c. 625, §16, is amended to read:

4. Acceptance of gifts and bequests. To accept gifts, bequests and endowments for purposes consistent with the objectives of this chapter. Such funds, if given as an endowment shall be invested in securities by the Treasurer of State according to the laws governing the investment of trust funds. All gifts, bequests and proceeds of invested endowment funds shall be used solely to carry out the purposes for which they were made and shall not be subject to STA-CAP or similar overhead charges;

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, the Maine State Archives is assessed a STA-CAP overhead rate of 53% on all dedicated income. If a person, by gift or bequest, gives the archives \$1,000 for archival research or restoration, only \$653.60 of that amount would actually be available for that purpose. Fully \$346.40 would revert to the General Fund for general overhead, including building maintenance and central services.

Unfortunately, since the Maine State Archives has substantial building space, primarily for records storage, this rate is markedly higher than for most agencies. This situation will tend to discourage future gifts since donors know that less than half of their donation will be applied to the program they wish to support. This bill will correct this conflict and encourage private support for the work of the Maine State Archives.
