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29	'Sec. 1. Study of school books and school libraries. Resolved: That the Department of Educational and Cultural Services shall study

Sec. 2. Conduct of study. Resolved: That in conducting or coordinating the study, the department shall take into account the results of research in textbook content by current national research groups and shall consult and collaborate with affected interested parties and groups in the State. The department may arrange to use the work of volunteers in conducting the study; and be it further

- Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Educational and Cultural Services submit its findings, recommendations and any necessary accompanying legislation to the Legislature by December 1, 1990; and be it further
- Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are 25 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purpose of this resolve.

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 358, L.D. 478 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the language of the original bill 5 while retaining the purpose of that bill. The amendment clarifies that the Department of Educational and Cultural Services may conduct the study of school textbooks and libraries 7 by contracting for all or part of the performance of the study. 9 The amendment also divides the study into 2 segments; a study of public school textbooks and a study of public school libraries and library services. Clearer direction is given on how the 11 department is to conduct the study, including the ability to 13 contract with outside institutions such as the University of Maine System. It is understood that the department will have the 15 assistance of approximately 700 volunteers in conducting the library part of the study. The report date for the study is changed to December 1, 1990. Finally, the amendment increases 17 the appropriation to provide adequate resources to complete the 19 study.
