STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Clarify the Law Regarding Immunity of Nonprofit Organization Directors, Officers and Volunteers.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	Sec. 1 14 MRSA §158-A, sub-§1, ¶¶B, C and D, as enacted by PL 1987, C. 646, §2 are repealed.
5	Sec. 2. 14 MRSA §158-A, sub-§1, ¶E is enacted to read:
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9	E. "Without compensation" means that a director, officer or volunteer does not receive compensation on a salary or a prorated equivalent basis. Compensation does not include
11	payment of actual expenses incurred in attending meetings or in executing responsibilities, the receipt of meals at
13	<u>meetings or the receipt of gifts not exceeding a total value</u> of \$300 in any 12 consecutive months.
15	Sec. 3. 14 MRSA, §158-A, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
17	646, §2, is repealed and the following enacted in its place.
19	2. Immunity. A director, officer or volunteer who serves without compensation is immune from civil liability for any act
21	or omission which results in damage or injury if that person was acting within the scope of that person's official functions and
23	duties as a director, officer or volunteer unless the damage or
25	injury caused by the act or omission of the director, officer or volunteer constitutes gross negligence or an intentional tort.
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29	STATEMENT OF FACT
31	PL 1987, chapter 646, An Act to Reform Provisions of the
33	Civil Justice System, was enacted in the Second Regular Session of the 113th Legislature. This bill provided, among other
35	things, for immunity for uncompensated directors, officers and volunteers of Maine nonprofit organizations. This new bill
00	proposes clarification of the term "compensation" so that a line
37	is drawn between permissible and impermissible gifts provided to directors, officers and volunteers. This bill also clarifies the
39	scope of immunity afforded to those directors, officers and volunteers.
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
