An Act to Require Pricing Disclosures on Vans and Pickup Trucks.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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United States Code, Title 15, Sections 1231-1233, requires the manufacturer to disclose on all new cars the manufacturer's suggested retail price for the vehicle options, and the cost of delivering the vehicle to the dealer. The purpose of this bill is to require similar disclosures on vans and pickup trucks in order to fully inform consumers as to the manufacturer's suggested prices.

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
