25	enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:
27	'Sec.1. 34-A MRSA §5406 is enacted to read:
29	<u>§5406. Community sentencing options unit; pilot program</u>
31	1. Definition. As used in this section, unless the context indicates otherwise, "community sentencing options" means
33	alternative corrections programs based in the community in order
35	to provide judges with a range of sentencing options which are nonincarcerative and utilize community resources and placements.
37	2. Establishment. The director, with the approval of the
39	commissioner, shall establish a community sentencing options unit within one of the probation and parole districts.
41	3. Responsibilities. The unit shall:
43	<u>A. Recommend community sentencing options within presentence investigation reports for all defendants</u>
45	convicted of Class A, B and C crimes; and
47	<u>B. Arrange and contract with public and private agencies</u> for services necessary to implement community sentencing
