## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Requiring Protective Headgear for All Operators and Passengers on Motorcycles, Motor Driven Cycles and Mopeds.



1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	29 MRSA §1376, as amended by PL 1983, c. 415, is repealed
_	and the following enacted in its place:
5	§1376. Protective headgear for motorcycle, motor driven cycle
7	and moped riders
9	Every person who operates a motorcycle, motor driven cycle or moped, whether on or off the highways, shall wear protective
11	headgear. Every person who rides as a passenger on a motorcycle,
	motor driven cycle or moped or in a sidecar attached to a
13	motorcycle or motor driven cycle, whether on or off the highways,
	shall wear protective headgear.
15	No operator of a motorcycle, motor driven cycle or moped may
17	allow a passenger to ride in violation of this section.
19	All protective headgear required in this section shall
	conform with minimum standards of construction and performance,

	specification Z90.1 or by the Federal Motor Vehicle Safety

25	Violation of this section is a civil violation for which a
