IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Change the Number of Rooms Required for Hotel Liquor Licenses.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	28-A MRSA §1061, sub-§4, ¶A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 623, §14, is amended to read:
5	-
7	A. The number of rooms required is based on the population of the municipality in which the hotel is located.
9	(1) If the hotel is located in a municipality of 3,000 or less population, the hotel must have at least 14 <u>12</u>
11	adequate sleeping rooms.
13	(2) If the hotel is located in a municipality of more than 3,000 but not more than 7,500 population, the
15	hotel must have at least 20 adequate sleeping rooms.
17	(3) If the hotel is located in a municipality of 7,500 or more population, the hotel must have at least 30
19	adequate sleeping rooms.
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23	STATEMENT OF FACT
25	The purpose of this bill is to allow smaller motels to serve liquor in rooms.
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
