IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act to Expand the Jurisdiction of the District Courts to Include Violations within Municipal Harbors and to Impose the Same Penalties for Harbor Violations that Have Been Created for Land Use Violations.

37	STATEMENT OF FACT
39	This law gives harbor masters, or code enforcement officers serving as harbor masters, the same enforcement authority and
41	power that exist in relation to land use violations. It is also designed to impose the same penalties on individuals or entities
43	that violate harbor ordinances as are imposed upon individuals or entities that violate land use ordinances. This bill responds to
45	a district court case, <u>Municipality of Wiscasset v. Glidden</u> ,

Maine District Court, District 6, Civil Action Docket #88-LU-1, decided May 10, 1988, in which the court decided that a violation

of a municipal harbor ordinance could not be prosecuted under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 4506 or the Maine

Rules of Civil Procedure, Rule 80K.

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
