IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

Resolve, Allocating the Proceeds of the \$3,000,000 Bond Issue for Land Acquisition, Construction, Repair and Renovation of Public Safety Facilities.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts 1 and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after 3 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 5 Whereas, the people of the State have ratified the issuance of bonds for improved public safety facilities; and 7 Whereas, the proceeds from the sale of these bonds are to be allocated by the Legislature; and 9 Whereas, 11 immediate implementation of public safety improvements is of paramount importance; and 13 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 15 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 17 safety; now, therefore, be it 19 Commissioner of Administration to implement expenditure of 21 \$3,000,000 bond proceeds. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Administration may direct and supervise the expenditure by the 23 Department of Public Safety of the \$3,000,000 bond issue authorized by Private and Special Law 1987, chapter 120, as 25 follows: 27 Alfred - site acquisition, survey, new buildings and utilities 29 construction, fuel services \$494,000 South Portland (Crosby Farms) -31 construction of garage, storage 33 and car wash, fuel services \$477,000 Dry Mills - construction of 35 building, radio repair and installation garage, fuel 37 \$956,000 services 39 Orono - communication building \$282,700 41 repair 43 Thomaston - building repair \$144,100 45 Pineland - building repair \$100,000 47 Related project expenditures including: design and professional 49 fees, \$293,977; 1% for art, \$23,288; site \$30,000; and soil analysis, 51 advertisement, insurance and legal fees, \$17,300; moveable equipment, 53 \$24,000; life cycle evaluation,

13 Transfer between items. Resolved: That the amount listed after each item is to be construed as a guide. Within each 15 section, any one or more amounts may be exceeded with the approval of the Governor by transfer from one item to another not 17 exceeding 10% in the aggregate.

19 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

- STATEMENT OF FACT
- Private and Special Law 1987, chapter 120, provided the 27 people of the State the opportunity to ratify the authorization of up to \$3,000,000 for public safety facilities. The bond issue 29 was approved in November, 1988, and consistent with Private and Special Law 1987, chapter 120, this resolve provides for the 31 allocation of the bond proceeds by the Legislature.
- Public safety facilities will be developed or improved in Alfred, South Portland, Dry Mills, Orono, Thomaston and New
 Gloucester.
