IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE

An Act Regarding Alcohol Credit Sales.

1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
3	28-A MRSA §705, sub-§1, \P A, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 45, Pt. A, §4, is amended to read:

7	A. Credit may be extended:
9	 By a hotel or club to bona fide registered guests or members; and
11	(2) By a hotel or Class A restaurant to the holder of
13	a credit card which authorizes the holder to charge goods or credits . <u>; and</u>
15	(3) By a hotel or Class A restaurant to the host of a private, prearranged function without a credit card.

19	STATEMENT OF FACT

23	This bill allows hotels and Class A restaurants licensed to serve alcoholic beverages to extend credit, without the use of a credit card, for alcoholic beverages sold to the hosts of
25	prearranged, private functions. This billing practice is illegal under current law.
