(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation must be enacted as an emergency measure in order that the relief to municipalities provided in this legislation may begin with the calendar year of 1989; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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30-A MRSA §5681, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

- 19 7. Recycling incentive. The Treasurer of State shall establish the Local Government Recycling Fund to provide an 21 incentive for municipal solid waste reduction and recycling efforts. The Treasurer of State shall distribute money from this 23 fund to any municipality which certifies in writing that it has a solid waste reduction and recycling program that meets the 25 requirements of this subsection. The Treasurer of State may request the Office of Waste Recycling and Reduction to review the 27 status of the municipal program. The Treasurer of State shall distribute money from this fund to eligible municipalities according to the formula in subsection 4. The Treasurer of State 29 shall distribute the balance of the fund on the 20th day of each 31 month.
- A. Beginning April 1, 1989, and prior to July 1, 1989, the
 Treasurer of State shall transfer to the Local Government
 Recycling Fund on the first day of each month an amount
 equal to 0.5% of the receipts from taxes imposed under Title
 36, Parts 3 and 8, and credited to the General Fund. A
 municipality that has a solid waste reduction and recycling
 program with at least one of the program components listed
 in paragraph D is eligible for revenue sharing under this
 paragraph.
- B. Beginning July 1, 1989, and prior to January 1, 1990, the Treasurer of State shall transfer to the Local Government

 Recycling Fund on the first day of each month an amount equal to 0.9% of the receipts from taxes imposed under Title

 36, Parts 3 and 8, and credited to the General Fund. A municipality that has a solid waste reduction and recycling program with at least 2 of the program components listed in paragraph D is eligible for revenue sharing under this paragraph.
