13 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 245, L.D. 575, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Records Management Laws"

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Amend the bill by striking out all of sections 1 and 2.

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:

'Sec. 5. Joint review and report. The Maine State Archives, the 21 Bureau of Purchases and the Office of Information Services shall 23 jointly review and determine the requirements to ensure the appropriate management, retention and disposition of record 25 series established through the use of automated media. The review shall address the availability of information to the Maine 27 State Archives concerning automated media conversion and storage equipment, and record series that are established. The review 29 shall examine the functions and authority of the 3 organizations to determine how a combined effort may best provide the assurance necessary for appropriate automated media records management by 31 the Maine State Archives. A joint report shall be prepared and 33 submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government by January 31, 1990, outlining the findings of the 35 review, noting regulatory and administrative measures taken and recommending any further legislation which may be necessary. 37

FISCAL NOTE

41 This bill will add an additional step to the approval process for automated equipment. All state agencies purchasing 43 automated equipment or information systems will incur some minor additional administrative costs and delays in purchases.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment deletes language regarding preapproval of media storage and equipment by the Maine State Archives.

Because of the complexity of defining and managing record series in automated media, and because of their related functions, the new section 3 provides that the Maine State 9 Archives, the Bureau of Purchases and the Office of Information 11 Services shall jointly review and report to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government regarding the appropriate 13 management, retention and disposition of record series established through the utilization of automated media. The 15 report, with recommendations, will be completed by January 31, 1990.
